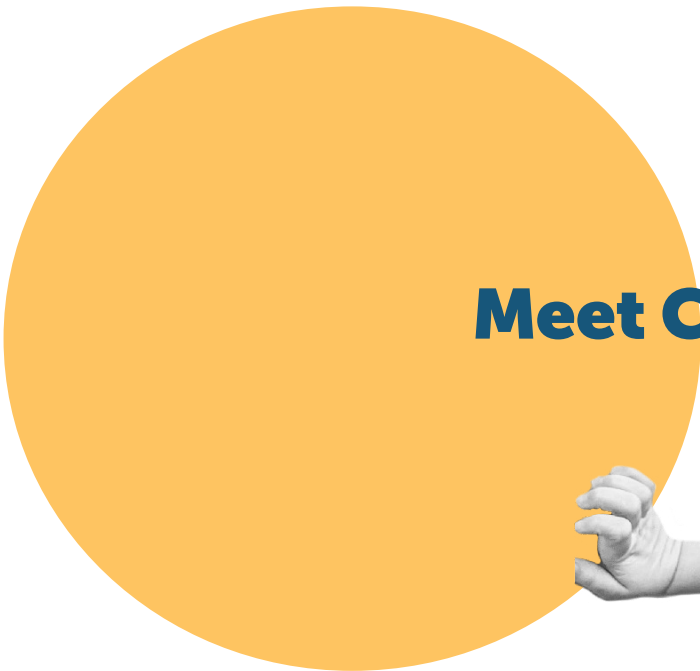
Thanks to your gift, Harper does not have to face a world without HOPE.

Camilla will graduate from HOPE preschool in June 2022, fully prepared for a successful transition to Kindergarten in the fall.

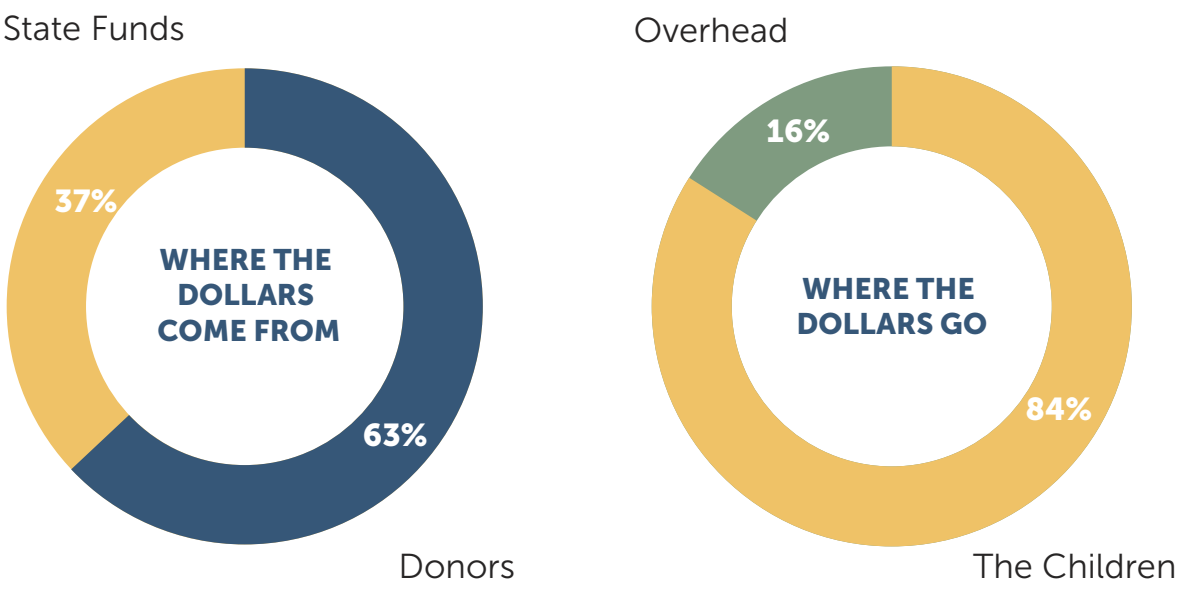
